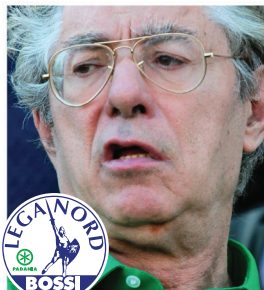


Who's who in Italy's rebel government



Il Popolo della Libertà (PdL), 238 seats: Ruling party founded by **Silvio Berlusconi** and **Gianfranco Fini** in 2009, by merging Forza Italia party with "post-Fascist" Alleanza Nazionale



Lega Nord, 59 seats: Second largest party in ruling coalition, led by **Umberto Bossi**, Minister for Institutional Reforms in Berlusconi's cabinet



Partito Democratico (PD), 206 seats: Largest opposition party. **Dario Franceschini** – party's Leader in Chamber of Deputies – submitted no-confidence motion with backing of IdV



Futuro e Libertà (FLI), 33 seats: **Gianfranco Fini**, speaker of lower house. Quit PdL in July, depriving Berlusconi of absolute majority. Fini is demanding prime minister's resignation



Unione dei Democratici Cristiani e di Centro (UDC), 35 seats: Led by **Pier Ferdinando Casini**. UDC has joined with FLI and two other parties in abstention alliance, which controls 84 votes

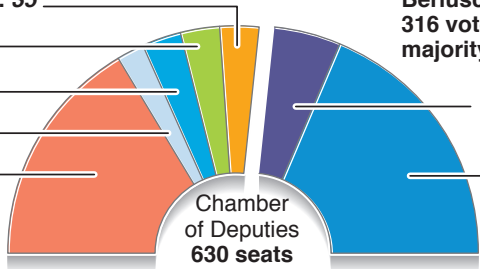


Italia dei Valori (IdV), 24 seats: Led by **Antonio Di Pietro**, anti-corruption party is member of PD-led coalition
