

# Europe accused of failing rendition victims

A report by Amnesty International has criticized the European Union for failing to hold member states to account over their alleged role in the CIA's controversial programme of rendition and secret detention following the attacks of September 11, 2001, in the United States

**1 Italy:** Has convicted U.S. and Italian agents for their involvement in 2003 abduction in Milan of **Abu Omar**, who was sent to Egypt and allegedly tortured

**2 Germany:** Carried out parliamentary inquiry into role of its agents in detention and alleged torture of German citizen **Muhammad Zammar**

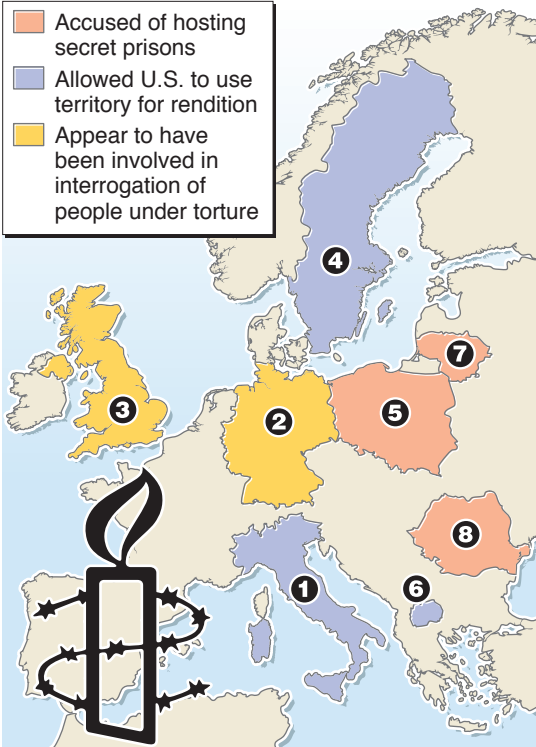
**3 UK:** Will hold inquiry into involvement of British officials in alleged mistreatment of nationals detained abroad

**4 Sweden:** Accused of failing to fully investigate rendition of two Egyptian asylum seekers

**5 Poland:** Investigating claims by Saudi terror suspect **Abd al-Rahim al-Nashiri** that he was held in secret CIA prison inside Poland

**6 Macedonia\*:** Denies wrongdoing in arrest and rendition of German citizen **Khaled el-Masri**

- Accused of hosting secret prisons
- Allowed U.S. to use territory for rendition
- Appear to have been involved in interrogation of people under torture



**7 Lithuania:** Launched criminal investigation after disclosure that it hosted two CIA prisons

**8 Romania:** Accused of hosting CIA prison. Has denied responsibility despite fresh evidence
