## 25 years of climate change summits

1985: Global carbon dioxide emissions estimated at 19.6 billion tonnes

major climate change summit warns that greenhouse gases will increase global temperature and could cause sea levels to rise by as much as one metre by 2050

■ 1985: First

- 1988: United Nations sets up Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) to analyse and report on scientific findings
- 1990: First IPCC report says world has warmed by 0.5°C over past century – future warming seems likely



levels by year 2000. So-called *Rio Agreement* is signed by 154 nations

■ 1995: First FCCC conference, COP 1 takes place in Berlin. Second IPCC report detects "signature" of man-made greenhouse warming. IPCC predicts global temperatures could rise by up to 3.5°C by 2100

**Kyoto but Senate**

- 1998: Hottest year on record
- 2000: IPCC scientists warn that world could warm by 6°C by 2100

- 2001: Third IPCC report warns of unprecedented global warming. U.S. President George W. Bush renounces Kyoto Protocol, claiming it will damage economy
- 2002: European Union, Japan and others ratify Kyoto, but Australia joins U.S. in refusing. To become legally binding, treaty must be ratified by at least 55 countries Russia is left to make or break treaty, but hesitates
- 2003: Deadly summer heatwave in Europe results in estimated 30,000 deaths. Scientists are uncertain if it is blip or new, more ominous trend
- 2004: Russia's President *Vladimir* Putin backs Kyoto
- 2005: After eight years, Kyoto Protocol comes into effect
- 2007: Fourth

- 2009: Hacked e-mails from *University of East Anglia* cast doubt over climate change science. *Copenhagen Climate Change Summit COP 15 –* fails to secure new deal required before Kyoto expires at end of 2012
- 2010: IPCC apologises for Himalayan glacier gaffe. Nov 29: 16th FCCC conference opens in Cancun, Mexico
