Interpol: Has issued Red Notice for Assange over alleged sex crimes

- Sweden: Turned down Assange's application for residency in October. European arrest warrant (EAW) issued by International Public Prosecution Office in Gothenburg in connection with rape allegations. Warrant upheld by Swedish appeal court. Assange has denied all charges
- United Kingdom: Assange believed to be in or near London -Metropolitan Police will enforce EAW if his location becomes known
