Apr 5: WikiLeaks posts classified U.S. military video on its website, showing indiscriminate killing of 15 people – including two Reuters staff – in Baghdad by Apache helicopter crew

Jul 25: More than 76,000 U.S. military documents released on war in Afghanistan

Oct 22: Almost 392,000 U.S. Army reports documenting war and occupation of Iraq to end of 2009 released

Nov 18: Sweden issues European arrest warrant (EAW) for Australian WikiLeaks founder, **Julian Assange** (right), in connection with alleged sex offences

Nov 28: WikiLeaks begins publishing first of 251,287 leaked United States embassy cables. U.S. brands leaks an “**attack on the international community**”

Dec 1: WikiLeaks evicted from **Amazon's** servers

Dec 3: U.S. domain manager **EveryDNS.net**, terminates **wikileaks.org**. Whistleblower shifts to mirror sites

Dec 4: U.S.-based **PayPal** blocks WikiLeaks' account

Dec 6: Credit card company **Mastercard** withdraws ability to make donations to WikiLeaks. Sweden issues new EAW and passes it to Britain's **Metropolitan Police**

Dec 7: Assange voluntarily surrenders to police in London – is arrested and refused bail. U.S.-based **Visa** blocks donations and payments to WikiLeaks

Dec 8: Australia's foreign minister **Kevin Rudd** (right) defends Assange, saying U.S. government should bear responsibility for any security breaches
