Iraqi parliament approves new government

Irag's parliament has approved a new government headed by Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki, ending nine months of deadlock after inconclusive elections. Lawmakers approved a total of 29 ministers – the remainder of the 42-member cabinet will initially be made up of acting ministers

Power-sharing deal on Nov 10 returned Shia Nuri al-Maliki (1) as prime minister, Kurd Jalal Talabani (2) as president and made Sunni Osama al-Nuiaifi (3) speaker of parliament
