Jan 4, 2011, Islamabad: Salman Taseer. Governor of Punjab who opposed law and sought presidential pardon for Asia Bibi, gunned down by one of his own bodyguards



Jul 2010, Faisalabad: Two Christian brothers accused of writing letter critical of Prophet Muhammad, shot dead outside court

BLASPHEMY LAW

- Under law, anyone who speaks ill of Islam and Prophet Muhammad commits crime and faces death penalty. But activists say vaque terminology has led to its misuse
- Most convictions are thrown out on appeal, but angry mobs have killed many people accused of blasphemy
- say convictions hinge primarily on witness testimony, often linked to personal vendettas
- Under pressure from religious conservatives, ruling Pakistan People's Party has backed away from scrapping law altogether
