

Haiti still struggling to recover

One year on, Haiti is still reeling from the effects of its worst earthquake in 200 years, and international efforts to deliver and sustain aid to the poorest country in the western hemisphere is being sorely tested

Jan 12, 2010:

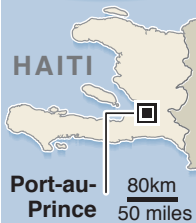
Magnitude 7.0 quake hits capital Port-au-Prince and surrounding regions

Mar: International donors pledge \$5.3bn for reconstruction

Oct: Cholera outbreak – blamed on UN Nepalese peacekeepers – triggers riots. Disease has killed over 3,700 to date

Dec: Violence erupts after preliminary presidential election results – widely considered suspect

Jan 2011: Political instability and lack of coordination between aid agencies threaten ongoing reconstruction efforts
