## Michael Jackson's doctor to stand trial

A U.S. judge has ordered that the personal physician of Michael Jackson will stand trial for involuntary manslaughter. Doctor Conrad Murray is accused of administering a lethal dose of propofol and other sedatives, leading to the singer's death in June 2009

## DRUGS FOUND IN MICHAEL JACKSON'S BODY

Propofol: Used to sedate patients on breathing machines or before surgery. Jackson used it as sleep aid

Autopsy report said amount of propofol in Jackson's system was equivalent to that used during anaesthesia for major surgery



Lorazepam Belongs to same class of drugs as Valium. Used to allay anxiety, and can be given intravenously before surgery to relax patients

Diazepam (Valium) Used to treat a range of conditions such as anxiety and insomnia

American Society of Anaesthesiologists Murray says propofol should "never be used outside of a controlled and monitored medical settina"

Autopsy report said that no resuscitation or monitoring equipment

Midazolam: Sedative, makes patients drowsy before surgery

Lidocaine: Painkiller

Ephedrine: Stimulant and decongestant
