

Egypt's opposition movements



6 APRIL YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Egyptian Facebook group started in 2008 to support industrial workers planning to strike on April 6
- Members, including many young well-educated Egyptians, make extensive use of social websites to organise events



شباب 6 أبريل

- Demands include resignation of interior minister, end to emergency law and rise in minimum wage



MUSLIM BROTHERHOOD

- Islamist group led by **Mohammed Badie** is largest and most organised opposition movement despite official ban

- Held 20% of

seats in last parliament but it lost its representatives in 2010 election

- Group, which mixes political activism with charity work, rejects use of violence and wants country governed according to Islamic law

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR CHANGE

- Umbrella organisation set up last year by Nobel laureate and former chief of UN nuclear watchdog, **Mohamed ElBaradei** to campaign for democracy and against corruption



- Includes both members of liberal parties and Islamists

- Demands end to **Mubarak's** rule, dissolution of parliament after last year's rigged elections and formation of transitional government

WAFD PARTY

- Liberal party led by **Al-Sayed al-Badawi**. Second biggest opposition bloc in last parliament, it boycotted second round of last elections because of widespread vote rigging



AL GHAD PARTY

- Liberal party led by **Ayman Nour** – prominent political dissident who was jailed after challenging Mubarak for the presidency in 2005
