Feb 6, 1911: Reagan born in Tampico, Illinois to Nelle Wilson Reagan and John Edward Reagan

■ 1932: Graduates from college with "C" averages. Work as radio announcer gives him media experience

1937: Signs contract with Warner Brothers



- 1940: Plays football legend George Gipp in his most acclaimed film. Knute Rockne, All American, earning nickname The Gipper. Marries actress Jane Wyman
- 1941: Daughter *Maureen* born. Reagan appointed to board of Screen Actors Guild
- 1942: Drafted into military, makes training and propaganda films 1945: Resumes acting

career, makes 54 movies in total. Adopts son *Michael*

- 1947: Elected president of SAG. Testifies before House Committee on **Un-American Activities**
- 1948: Reagan and Wyman divorce



- 1952: Marries actress Nancy Davis. Daughter Patti born
- 1954: Makes celebrity appearances at factories throughout U.S. Experience shapes his political views especially encroachment on individual freedom by government
- **1958:** Son *Ron* born Pictures: Associated Press, Getty Images

The midwestern boy who became a Hollywood actor, governor of California and 40th President of the United States, was born 100 years ago

■ 1968: Makes tentative run for presidency

■ 1969: Sends in National Guard to break up flowerpower protests at University of California at Berkeley

1970: Re-elected California governor

■ 1979: Announces candidacy for president, chooses George Bush as his running mate

■ 1980: Elected president in landslide victory over incumbent Jimmy Carter. At age 69, he is oldest man ever to win presidency

1981: Inauguration Day – Iran releases 52 hostages held at U.S. embassy in Tehran for 444 days

Mar: Survives assassination attempt

Aug: Gives striking air traffic controllers 48 hours to get back to work and fires those who refuse

■ 1982: In speech to British parliament, Reagan predicts fall of Soviet Union

■ 1983: Describes Soviet Union as "evil empire". Unveils proposal for Strategic Defence Initiative, dubbed Star Wars

1984: Advocates helping Contra "freedom fighters" in Nicaragua

Oct: Congress outlaws military aid to Contras

Nov: Wins second term, again by landslide

■ 1985: Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev pledge to cut nuclear weapons



1986: Orders air strikes against Libya in retaliation for bombing of West Berlin disco in which two U.S. servicemen are killed

■ 1986-87, Iran-Contra scandal: Administration covertly sells weapons to Iran, via Israel, in exchange for release of hostages held by *Hezbollah* in Lebanon. Profits diverted to Contras fighting Nicaragua's leftwing government. Reagan acknowledges deal was "a mistake"

1987: In speech in Berlin, Reagan demands "Mr Gorbachev, tear down this wall"

Dec: Gorbachev and Reagan sign INF treaty, resulting in destruction of 2,692 intermediate-range nuclear weapons

1989: Reagan retires to to his Los Angeles home

■ Sep: Undergoes surgery to remove fluid on his brain



Nov: Berlin Wall falls. Germany unified in 1990

■ Dec 1991: Collapse of Soviet Union ends Cold War

1994: Reagan discloses he has Alzheimer's disease. "I now begin the journey

that will lead me into the sunset of my life"

Jun 5, 2004: Ronald Reagan dies at age 93
