Oman deploys army units fearing more unrest

The Omani military is deploying troops north of the capital, Muscat, and near the border with the United Arab Emirates, in anticipation of more anti-government protests that have rocked the port town of Sohar



Oman is oldest independent Arab state, and has been ruled by AI Said family since 1744

Qaboos bin Said, 70, (pictured) became Sultan in 1970 after overthrowing his father in palace coup

He has absolute power and appoints cabinet. Parliament set up in 1992 only advises and has no legislative powers. Political parties are banned

Issue of succession remains. unclear, as Sultan has no children or named heir

Qaboos has tried to calm unrest by promising 50,000 new jobs, unemployment benefits and possible widening of parliamentary powers
