Benghazi-based human rights lawyer and community organiser

Masters degree in political science and PhD in strategic planning from Pittsburgh University.



Appointed chairman of National Economic Development Board in 2009, reporting directly to prime minister

Ali Issawi Foreign affairs

Served as minister of economy from 2007 to 2009. Resigned as Libyan ambassador to India when uprising



began, in protest at government violence against citizens

Among officers who took part in 1969 coup that brought Gaddafi to power. Spent 15 years in prison from 1975 for plotting to overthrow regime

Ahmed al-Zubair Ahmed al-Sanusi Political prisoners

Nephew of *King Idris I*, arrested in 1973 for conspiracy. Served 31 years in jail, making him Libya's longest-serving prisoner of conscience

Fathi Mohammed Baja Benghazi

U.S.-educated professor of political science, helped draft manifesto for revolution based on two principles: national unity and democracy

Fatih Terbil Representative of youth

Human-rights activist and lawyer who organized peaceful demonstration on Feb 15 by families of 1,200 prisoners massacred by security forces in 1996.

His arrest triggered protests that sparked uprising
