## Chinese dissident artist Ai Weiwei

1957: Born in Beijing to parents once sent to labour camp due to his poet father's political leanings

1981: After studing at Beijing Film Academy, Ai moves to New York -

begins to create conceptual art using ready made objects

1993 · Returns to China helps establish experimental artists' Beijing East Village

1995: Early work shows Ai shattering priceless

ancient Chinese vase - destruction and recreation become recurring

theme throughout much of his art 2008: Helps

design Beijing "Bird's Nest" Olympic stadium. but later disowns

Games as "fake smile" concealing China's problems

2009: Claims he was beaten by police for investigation into poor school construction leading to deaths of over 5.000 children in 2008 Sichuan earthquake

Nov 2010: Placed under house arrest in Beijing
