

- 1926, Apr 21: Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary born at 17 Bruton Street, Mayfair, London, first child of Duke and Duchess of York. Younger sister Princess Margaret born four years later
- General strike brings Britain to a standstill. *John Logie Baird* invents television. *British Commonwealth of Nations* born
- 1929: Wall Street Crash triggers Great Depression of 1930s



■ 1933: Rise to power of Nazi leader Adolf Hitler. Suppression of Jews begins in Germany under Third Reich

■ 1936: Abdication crisis in Britain. Elizabeth's father becomes *King George VI*

■ 1939: World War II begins when Hitler invades Poland – Britain and France declare war on Germany

■ 1940: Winston Churchill becomes British Prime Minister.


- 1973: Vietnam War ends

- 1985: Mikhail Gorbachev becomes leader of Soviet Union
- 1986: World's worst nuclear accident takes place at *Chernobyl*

 - 1998: Good Friday Agreement paves way for peace settlement in Northern Ireland
- 1999: Queen opens new Welsh National Assembly in Cardiff and Scottish Parliament in Edinburgh
- 2000, Aug 4: Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother turns 100
- 2001, Sep 11: Terrorist attacks on New York and Washington
