

Al Qaeda's interim leader

Al Qaeda has chosen a "caretaker" leader following the death of Osama bin Laden. Egyptian militant Saif al-Adel will head the terror organization temporarily until the expected permanent appointment of bin Laden's deputy chief Avman al-Zawahiri SAIF AL-ADFI

- ▶ 1960/1963: Born Egypt. Name means "Sword of Justice" in Arabic. Also known as Muhammad Ibrahim Makkawi - former Egyptian army officer
- 1981: Suspected of being involved in assassination of Egyptian president Anwar Sadat
- ▶ 1988: Leaves Egypt to join mujahideen fighting Soviet occupation of Afghanistan
- ▶ 1990s: Believed to have set up Al Qaeda training camps in Sudan, Somalia and Afghanistan
- ▶ 1998: Accused by U.S. of planning attacks on American embassies in Kenya and Tanzania
- 2001: Flees Afghanistan after U.S. invasion, reportedly held under house arrest in Iran
- 2010: Moves to Pakistan, directed by bin Laden to plan new Al Qaeda attacks on West. Believed

May 2011: Appointed interim operational leader. Ayman al-Zawahiri (above)
