New Icelandic eruption threat to aviation

An Icelandic volcano is threatening to disrupt European air travel again, just a year after the last eruption grounded flights for almost a week. Ash from Grimsvotn volcano has created a plume 13km high and is expected to cover a large area of the North Atlantic by Tuesday morning
