

Peru's presidential election run-off



Keiko Fujimori, 35

■ Congresswoman and daughter of former president, **Alberto Fujimori** – now serving 25-year jail sentence for bribery and organising death squads during his 1990-2000 regime

■ Keiko denies she aims to secure pardon for her father and defends his record in defeating Marxist **Shining Path** rebels, plus saving Peru from hyperinflation and economic collapse

■ Supports free market economic policy – pledging to reduce costs of doing business by 20% in five years – and advocates tough approach to crime

■ She also promises to improve social programmes and expand infrastructure in poor areas

■ Keiko Fujimori would be Peru's first female president

Ollanta Humala, 48

■ Left-wing nationalist, came to prominence in 2000 when he led failed military revolt against then-president, Alberto Fujimori

■ Former army colonel narrowly lost 2006 run-off to current president, **Alan Garcia**

■ Promises more state control of economy and to extract higher royalties from mining companies – accounting for more than half Peru's exports – to reduce poverty

■ Seeks to reassure nervous investors with promises of careful fiscal policy and respect for Peru's free trade deals

■ Accused of violating human rights during fight against Shining Path in 1990s, when he was army captain. Denies allegations
