

Wimbledon unveils new courts for 2011 Championship

The All England Club will unveil two new courts for the 2011 Wimbledon Championship, concluding a 17-year project to upgrade the world famous tennis venue. Courts 3 and 4 will bring the overall ground capacity to 38,500 and the number of courts in use back up to 19 from 17 last year
