

International Criminal Court's most wanted

The International Criminal Court in The Hague is seeking the arrest of 10 war crimes suspects – all of them Africans – but with no police force of its own, the court is reliant on member states to enforce arrests



Joseph Kony

Head of **Lord's Resistance Army** (LRA) – rebel group engaged in conflict with Ugandan government

Kony and senior LRA members **Okot Odhiambo** and **Dominic Ongwen** wanted since 2005 for war crimes, including murder and rape of civilians

Bosco Ntaganda

Commander of armed militia group in eastern D.R. Congo. Now acting as Congolese army general

Arrest warrant issued 2006 for alleged use of child soldiers from 2002-03. Co-accused **Thomas Lubanga** currently on trial at ICC



Omar al-Bashir

President of Sudan has maintained autocratic rule since seizing power in Islamic-backed coup in 1989

Accused in 2009 of war crimes and genocide in Darfur. Sudanese official **Ahmed Haroun** and militia leader **Ali Kushayb** also accused

Muammar Gaddafi

Libyan leader for 42 years, has vowed to “die a martyr” in his fight against rebel and NATO forces

Issued with arrest warrant June 27 for ordering attacks on civilians. Son **Saif al-Islam** and intelligence chief **Abdullah al-Sanoussi** also indicted
