International Criminal Court's most wanted

The International Criminal Court in The Hague is seeking the arrest of 10 war crimes suspects – all of them Africans – but with no police force of its own, the court is reliant on member states to enforce arrests



Joseph Kony

Head of Lord's Resistance Army (LRA) – rebel group engaged in conflict with Ugandan government

Bosco Ntaganda

Commander of armed militia group in eastern D.R. Congo. Now acting as Congolese army general



Kony and senior LRA members *Okot Odhiambo* and *Dominic Ongwen* wanted since 2005 for war crimes, including murder and rape of civilians

Arrest warrant issued 2006 for alleged use of child soldiers from 2002-03. Co-accused *Thomas Lubanga* currently on trial at ICC



Omar al-Bashir

President of Sudan has maintained autocratic rule since seizing power in Islamic-backed coup in 1989

Muammar Gaddafi

Libyan leader for 42 years, has vowed to "die a martyr" in his fight against rebel and NATO forces



Accused in 2009 of war crimes and genocide in Darfur. Sudanese official **Ahmed Haroun** and militia leader **Ali Kushavb** also accused

Issued with arrest warrant June 27 for ordering attacks on civilians. Son **Saif al-Islam** and intelligence chief **Abdullah al-Sanoussi** also indicted
