News of the World



- founded by John Browne Bell
- 1850-1900: Newspaper quickly establishes reputation in Victorian era for its coverage of sensational stories
- 1950: Broadsheet becomes world's biggest-selling English-language paper with 8.44 million copies
- 1969: Rupert Murdoch buys
 News of the World. Paper gains
 nickname News of the Screws for
 its celebrity-based sex scoops
- 1984: Changes to tabloid format
- **2000:** *Rebekah Brooks*, née Wade, *(above left)* appointed editor
- 2007: Royal editor and private investigator jailed for hacking into mobile phones of royal family
- 2011: Claims allege that paper hacked mobile phones of murdered girl in 2002, families of London's 7/7 bomb victims in 2005, and relatives of British soldiers killed in Iraq and Afghanistan Circulation falls to 2.6 m
