

# Legal steps in Breivik case



■ **Anders Behring Breivik** faces terrorism charges over Friday's twin terror attacks in Norway which killed 76 people. **Breivik admits attacks, but does not accept criminal responsibility**

■ **Jul 25:** Remanded in custody for eight weeks after court hearing held in private so as not to give Breivik platform for his far-right views

■ Doctors will then assess Breivik's mental health to see if he is fit for trial, while police collect evidence to build case. **Experts say trial could be at least a year away**

■ Norway has no death penalty and maximum jail term is 21 years. **Sentence can be extended for renewable five years if prisoner deemed likely to repeat offence**

■ New law will soon raise maximum sentence for terrorism in Norway to 30 years. **But Breivik cannot be tried under law which has not yet entered into force**
