MUBARAK CHARGES

Conspiring with Adli and police officers over brutal suppression of uprising in which around 850 people were killed and over 6,000 wounded

- Squandering public money in natural gas deal with Israel. Salem, also charged, alleged to have siphoned \$714 million out of deal
- Allowing Salem to acquire large tracts of state land in tourist region of South Sinai
- Using position to secure wealth and privileges for himself and his sons, including property valued at \$6.7 million

If convicted, he could face death penalty
