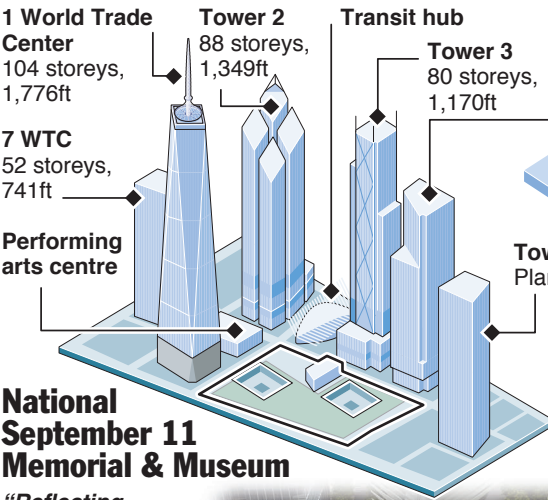


# 9/11 Memorial remembers victims of terror

The memorial, located at the site of the destroyed World Trade Center, will be dedicated on September 11, 2011 – the 10th anniversary of the fateful attacks. It opens to the public on September 12



**Area:** 8 acres – approx. half of WTC site  
**Cost:** \$700 million

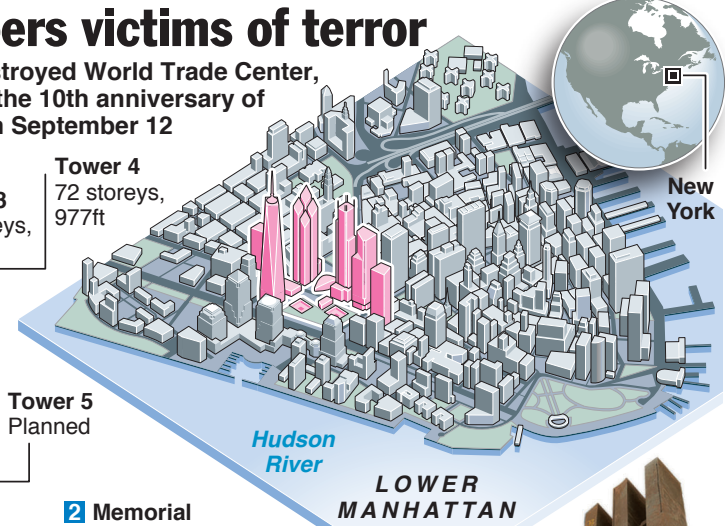
**1 Reflecting pools:** Set within footprints of twin towers. Two-stage waterfalls cascade down sides and into central depths of pools, which symbolise voids that will never fill

**VICTIMS:** Names of 2,982 people killed on 9/11 and in 1993 WTC attack, inscribed on bronze parapets around perimeter of pools

6 names

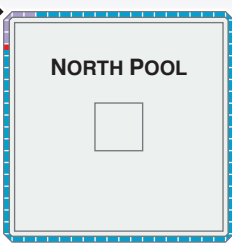
**2 Memorial Plaza:** "Survivor Tree", extensively damaged on 9/11, replanted among 400 trees that convey spirit of hope and renewal



**3 Museum:** Visitors follow ramp down to core exhibitions at bedrock within original foundations of World Trade Center. Features include part of slurry wall and "Survivor Stairs" used by hundreds to escape destruction. Museum opens Sep 2012

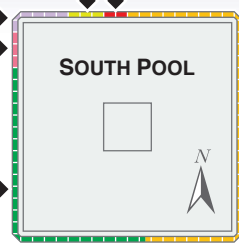
**North Tower** 1,470 names
