

Gaddafi's surviving family members

Muammar Gaddafi's son Saadi has fled to Niger, leaving just the locations of the former leader and sons Saif al-Islam and Mutassim still unknown

Col. Muammar Gaddafi (68).

Ruler for 42 years, has vowed to remain in Libya until death. Wanted by International Criminal Court for crimes against humanity



Safia Farkash:

Gaddafi's second wife and mother of seven of his children. Couple also adopted two children, **Milad** and **Hanna**

Ayesha (35). Lawyer served as member of defence team of executed Iraqi leader, Saddam Hussein. Married, three children



Saif al-Islam (39). Perceived as Gaddafi's successor. Wanted by ICC on charges of alleged torture and killing of civilians

Hannibal (35). Head of state shipping company has history of violence – arrested in Paris in 2005 and Geneva in 2008 on assault charges



Khamis (28). 32nd Brigade commander implicated in Aug 23 massacre of 150 prisoners. Reportedly killed in Aug 29 airstrike

Mohammed (41). Only child of Gaddafi's first marriage. Head of state-run telecoms company. Loyalist forces helped him flee house arrest



Saif al-Arab (29). Student in Munich. Returned to Libya in February. Killed April 30 in airstrike on Gaddafi's compound in Tripoli

Saadi (38). Former footballer who had brief career in Italy's Serie A. Has lived in Italy for much of past five years. Involved in film industry



Mutassim (36). Playboy boasts of spending \$2 million per month on lavish lifestyle. Heads his own unit in Libyan army

Milad (age unknown). Little is known about adopted son credited with saving Gaddafi's life during U.S. bombing of Tripoli in 1986



Hanna (29). Gaddafi claimed his adopted daughter was killed in 1986 airstrike, but evidence found in Tripoli indicates she is alive
