

# Ballpoint pen goes digital

Wacom's latest pen allows conventional ink-on-paper sketching with a pressure-sensitive ballpoint. The *Inkling* transfers the sketch – complete with layers – to a PC or Mac, where it can be edited using image software

**Receiver:** Tracks penstrokes and uploads them to computer. Compatible with most graphics software

**Layer button:** Allows sketch to be structured in layers

**Pen:** Ultrasonic and infrared links relay data to receiver  
**Up to 1,024 levels of pressure sensitivity allow natural strokes**  
2cm distance needed between receiver and sketch area

Rechargeable battery Ni-MH

Receiver clips onto paper

**Foldable case:** Acts as charger to both pen and receiver. **Three-hour charge gives eight hours of use**

**Paper:** Maximum size A4

**File formats:** JPG, BMP, TIFF, PNG, SVG, PDF
