- Palestinian President *Mahmoud Abbas* expected to submit request for admission of Palestinian member state to UN Secretary General *Ban Ki Moon* on September 20
- For admission to be put to vote at General Assembly, Security Council needs to approve it with nine votes out of 15 and no veto from any of permanent members. U.S. says it will veto application
