China condemns U.S. deal on Taiwan F-16s

China has attacked U.S. plans to upgrade Taiwan's fleet of U.S.-built F-16 fighters, saying the deal would "undermine bilateral relations". However, the decision to upgrade rather than supply more advanced jets is being seen by some analysts as a move to appease Beijing

\$5.3 billion upgrade: Taiwan's 145 *F-16A/Bs* will be given virtually same capabilities as late-model *F-16C/Ds* that Taipei has sought for five years without success

- Pilot training: Five-year, \$500 million extension of programme to train Taiwanese F-16 pilots at *Luke Air Force Base* in Arizona
- Spare parts: Worth \$52 million, to equip Taiwan's F-16, F-5, and C-130 aircraft

 radar sets giving F-16 advantage
 over current Chinese fighters
