The Haggani Network, which allegedly has the backing of elements within the Pakistani spy agency - the Inter Services Intelligence directorate (ISI)

- is responsible for some of the most lethal attacks in Afghanistan



Jalalludin Haggani: CIA asset received cash and weapons via ISI in 1980s to fight Soviet army. Forged close links with Al Qaeda following 2001 U.S.-led invasion Sirai Haggani: Son of, and more extreme than, Jalalludin, Group leader since 2005
