Khamis (28). 32nd Brigade commander implicated in Aug 23 massacre of 150 prisoners. Aug 29: Killed in airstrike

Mohammed (41). Only child of Gaddafi's first marriage. Head of staterun telecoms company. Loyalist forces helped him flee house arrest

Milad (age unknown). Little is known about adopted son credited with saving Gaddafi's life during U.S. bombing of Tripoli in 1986
