Boko Haram – an Al Qaeda-inspired sect which wants strict Islamic law throughout Nigeria – has threatened more attacks after a series of blasts and gun battles killed at least 150 people in the country's northeast

■ Dec 24: Boko Haram bombings kill at least 80 people in Jos. Some 200 killed in reprisal attacks between Christians and Muslims, with many hacked to death or burned alive

Jun 2011: First suicide bomb attack in Nigeria targets police headquarters in Abuja. Bomb attacks on bar-cafe in Maiduquri kill 25 people

Aug 25: Boko Haram attacks police station and two banks in Gombi, killing 12 people

Aug 26: Car bomb attack on UN building in Abuja kills at least 23 and injures over 70 others

■ Nov 4: Bomb and gun attacks target police stations, army base and churches in Damaturu, Maiduguri and two other small towns, killing at least 150 people
