

U.S.-Pakistan ties in crisis

- Jan 27, 2011: CIA contractor Raymond Davis kills two Pakistani men in Lahore in apparent self defence. Davis's arrest sparks suspention of U.S.-
- Apr 22: Supplies to Nato forces in Afghanistan halted for three days in protest over drone attacks
 - May 2: U.S. commandos stage covert raid that kills Osama bin Laden in garrison town of Abbottabad, heightening suspicions that Pakistani security knew where Al Qaeda chief was hiding. Pakistan parliament calls for review of U.S. ties
- Jun 2: Top U.S. military chief Adm. Mike Mullen admits significant cut in U.S. troops after Islamabad requests U.S. scales back contingent of 200 military advisors stationed in Pakistan
- Jul 8: Mullen claims Islamabad sanctioned killing of journalist who linked Pakistan military to Al Qaeda - Islamabad rejects accusation
- Jul 10: U.S. suspends \$800m of military aid to Pakistan
- Sep 22: Mullen angers Pakistan by accusing ISI military spy agency of supporting Haggani militant group in Afghanistan
 - Nov 26: NATO air strike kills 24 Pakistani troops at checkpoint on Afghan border. NATO and U.S. apologise, calling deaths tragic

Pakistan Prime Minister Yousuf Raza Gilani retaliates by shutting NATO supply routes into Afghanistan and demands U.S. vacate air base used for drone strikes. Also announces Pakistan will boycot talks on Afghanistan's future due to take place in Bonn, Germany
