U.S.-Taliban dialogue reaches delicate juncture

Ten months of secret talks between the U.S and Afghanistan's Taliban insurgents have reached a critical turning point, say senior officials

Dec 19: Unnamed senior U.S. officials disclose they are considering transfer of some Taliban prisoners from Guantanamo Bay into Afghan custody in return for gestures from Taliban, such as denunciation of international terrorism

Future: U.S. publicly supports Taliban political office outside Afghanistan, possibly in Qatar, to be used to aid future negotiations. Indicating the fragility of discussions, Hamid Karzai last week recalled his Qatar ambassador in protest
