

Salafist Group for Preaching and Combat (GSPC). Strength: Around 500 members



Ansar al-Din (Supporters of the Faith): Jihadist group based in Kidal. led by Ivad Aq Ghali, former Mali Tuareg rebel leader. Aims to unite members of former Gaddafi militias under banner of Sharia law. Strength: 2,000-4,000
