Highs and lows of Harry Redknapp



- 1947: Born March 2 in Poplar, east London
- 1958: Trainee at Tottenham Hotspur
- 1965: Turns professional with *West Ham Utd*, alongside England's World Cup-winning captain *Bobby Moore*
- 1982: Appointed *Bournemouth* manager loses first match 9-0 but wins Third Division title in 1987
- 1990: Survives serious car accident in Italy
- 1994: Takes over at West Ham, nurturing young talent including nephew *Frank Lampard*, *Rio Ferdinand* and *Jermain Defoe*
- 2001: Sacked after row with chairman. Appointed Director of Football at Portsmouth by chairman *Milan Mandaric*
- 2002: Becomes manager Portsmouth win Division One title
- 2004: Joins local rivals Southampton relegated at end of season
- 2005: Returns to Portsmouth, then struggling in Premier League
- 2006: BBC broadcasts investigation into corruption in football but independent inquiry finds nothing to incriminate Redknapp



- 2007: Redknapp and Mandaric arrested on suspicion of tax fraud. Released without charge, police pay damages for raid on Redknapp's home
- 2008: Portsmouth wins FA Cup
- 2008: Joins Tottenham leads team from foot of table to Carling Cup final
- 2010: Redknapp charged with tax fraud
- 2011: Spurs reach quarter-finals of UEFA Champions League
- Feb 8, 2012: Redknapp and Mandaric acquitted. England coach *Fabio Capello* resigns Redknapp is favourite for top job
