
Long slog to the Republican nomination

Following a bruising primary season, former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney has clinched the 1,144 delegates needed to become the Republican presidential nominee to challenge Barack Obama in November





Apr 3: Romney wins 83 delegates, expanding his count to 655, or 57% of those needed for nomination

Apr 10: Santorum guits after winning 259 delegates

May 29: Romney wins Texas, taking him well over 1,144 nomination threshold
