Senior Al Qaeda leader Abu Yahya al-Libi, killed in a U.S. drone strike, was believed to be a "gatekeeper" between the Al Qaeda leadership and operatives in the field

ABU YAHYA AL-LIBI

- 1963: Born in Libya. Studies chemistry at Sebha University in early 1980s
- 1980s: Joins Libyan Fighting Group battling Soviet troops in Afghanistan
- 2001: Becomes Taliban's "webmaster" in Karachi before being arrested in 2002
- 2005: Escapes U.S.-run prison at Bagram airbase in Afghanistan
- **2009:** Mistakenly reported killed in drone strike in Pakistan
- 2011: Following death of *Osama* bin Laden, Libi becomes Al Qaeda's second-in-command after Egyptian-born Ayman al-Zawahiri
- Jun 4, 2012: Killed in Pakistan

As top cleric and propaganda chief, Libi had authority to issue fatwas and provide guidance to militants
