Drugmakers fined in U.S. Britain's GlaxoSmithKline is the

latest pharmaceutical giant hit with a record fine by the U.S. authorities



- Jul 2012: GlaxoSmithKline to pay \$3 billion for illegally promoting anti-depressants *Wellbutrin* and *Paxil*, and for failing to disclose safety data about diabetes drug *Avandia*
- Sep 2009: *Pfizer Inc* pleads guilty to criminal charge relating to promotion of now-withdrawn *Bextra* pain medicine and 13 other drugs. Agrees to pay \$2.3 billion
- Jan 2009: Eli Lilly and Co pays \$1.4 billion to settle probes into sales of Zyprexa schizophrenia drug for unapproved uses
- Sep 2008: Cephalon agrees to pay \$425 million to settle allegations that it marketed three drugs for non-approved uses
- Feb 2008: *Merck & Co* fined more than \$650 million over failure to pay healthcare rebates for cholesterol drug *Zocor* and pain reliever *Vioxx*
- Sep 2007: Bristol-Myers Squibb pays more than \$510 million to settle charges of illegally marketing and pricing its products, and for alleged bribes to healthcare providers
