- 1934: Born in Algeria
- 1984-91: Arab League envoy. Helps to negotiate end to Lebanese civil war
 - 1991-93: Algeria's foreign minister
- 1994: UN special representative in South Africa. Helps oversee democratic elections that brought **Nelson Mandela** to power

■ 1997-99 / 2001: Twice appointed as UN's top envoy for Afghanistan

- before and after end of Taliban rule

 2004: UN special envoy in Iraq.
 Helps put together interim governmen
- Helps put together interim government after U.S.-led invasion

Brahimi is one of "The Elders" – group of 11 world leaders working for global peace and human rights
