Supports Jacob Zuma's bid to become president of South Africa, telling rally he would "kill for Zuma" ■ Mar 2010: Convicted of hate speech by Equality Court for saying that a woman who accused Zuma of rape "had a nice time" Sings apartheid-era protest song featuring words "shoot the Boer (white farmer)".
