- Junior U.S. Open champion 2004

 2005: Turns pro. Beats Santiago
- Ventura 6-1 6-2 at Queen's Club his first ATP win
- 2006: Beats *Lleyton Hewitt* his first ATP tournament title, San Jose
- 2008: First Masters Series title at Cincinnati, beats *Novak Diokovic*
- U.S. Open 2008: Loses to Roger Federer in straight sets
- Australian Open 2010: Loses to
- Roger Federer in straight sets
- Australian Open 2011: Loses to Novak Djokovic
