▲ The Boeing B-29 bomber made its inaugural flight. It entered service towards the end of World War II and was used to carry out the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bomb

1909: Kwame Nkrumah, Ghana's first prime minister, was born

1992: The Vatican and Mexico established full diplomatic relations, ending a 130-year-long rift

2003: Nasa's Galileo space probe crashed into Jupiter at the end of its eight year mission
