▲ **Argentinian-born revolutionary Ernesto “Che” Guevara was captured and killed by troops in Bolivia while leading a Cuban-sponsored guerrilla force**

1562: Gabriel Fallopius, Italian anatomist after whom the female reproductive Fallopian tubes are named, died

1876: Alexander Graham Bell and Thomas A. Watson talked by telephone over a two-mile (3km) wire

1975: Soviet dissident and human rights campaigner Andrei Sakharov was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize
