▲ **British archaeologist Howard Carter and Lord Carnarvon entered the tomb of Tutankhamun, the first men to enter since it was sealed in 1337 BC**

1832: The first horse-drawn streetcar pulled on rails entered public service in New York

1979: The International Olympic Committee voted to re-admit China after an absence of 21 years

1996: South Korea's parliament ratified the country's membership to the OECD

2011: NASA launched the robotic Mars Science Laboratory, the largest rover yet sent to Mars, with the aim of finding evidence of life
