Unable to read or write a note of music, *Jimi Hendrix* became one of the most innovative musicians of the 20th century, capturing the zeitgeist of the Sixties

Nov 27, 1942: Johnny Allen Hendrix born in Seattle, United States. Parents divorce when he is nine years old

■ 1958: Hendrix joins his first band. *The Velvetones*

1962-65: After year in U.S.
Army, Hendrix works as session guitarist under name *Jimmy James*.
Performs in backing bands for soul.

blues and R&B artists including Sam Cooke and Wilson Pickett. Forms his own band. Blue Flame

■ 1966: Hendrix moves to London, forms *Jimi Hendrix Experience* with drummer *Mitch Mitchell* and bass player *Noel Redding*. Debut single, *Hey Joe*, reaches number 6 in British charts

■ 1967: First album *Are You*Experienced shoots to number 2 in UK, behind Beatles' Sgt. Pepper. Groundbreaking album combines wah-wah, fuzz, feedback and other cutting-edge effects

■ 1968: Hendrix records Axis: Bold As Love and Electric Ladyland – third and final album of new material by Jimi Hendrix Experience



1969: His rendition of *The Star*Spangled Banner at Woodstock
Festival whips mud-soaked
audience into a frenzy

1970: Hendrix records live album, Band of Gypsys

Sep 18, 1970: Jimi Hendrix dies from drug-related asphyxia at age of 27
