Tour winner LeMond bids to clean up cycling

Three-time Tour de France winner Greg LeMond will run for the presidency of UCI, the sport's governing body, after accusing the current and previous leadership of corruption during the Lance Armstrong doping scandal

LEMOND CYCLING CAREER

- 1980: Selected for U.S. Olympic team. Boycott of Moscow Olympics meant he never competed
 1983: First American to win World Road Race
- Championship
- 1984: Takes part in his first Tour de France
- 1985: Helps Tour great *Bernard Hinault* to victory
- 1986: First non-European to win Tour de France. Following disqualifications of both Armstrong and Floyd Landis, he is now only American to keep title
 - 1987: Survives shotgun hunting accident
- 1989: Wins Tour de France and World titles
- 1990: Wins third Tour de France without a single stage victory
