TIMELINE OF KURDISH-TURKISH CONFLICT

- Nov 27, 1978: Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) founded
- Aug 1984: PKK takes up arms with aim of creating ethnic homeland in southeast
- Sep 1992: Turkish army launches first major cross-border operation against PKK in northern Iraq
- Mar 1993: PKK declares first unilateral ceasefire
- Feb 1999: PKK leader *Abdullah Ocalan* captured in Kenya

- Aug: PKK withdraws all armed units to northern Iraq
- Jun 2004: PKK resumes armed campaign over what it calls "annihilation operations" by Turkey
- Feb 2008: Turkey launches ground incursion into northern Irag
- Jul-Aug 2011: PKK steps up attacks, killing some 80 Turkish security personnel
- Jan 10, 2013: France and Turkey condemn "executions" of women
