▲ Japan was struck by a 9.0 earthquake that created a devastating tsunami that killed more than 15,800 people. It then triggered a nuclear emergency

1926: Eamon de Valera resigned as head of the Irish Sinn Fein because the treaty with the British partitioned Ireland

1935: Hermann Goering created the German Air Force, the Luftwaffe

1998: Thousands of students in Indonesia burned an effigy of President Suharto in protest at the financial crisis

2006: Former Yugoslav President Slobodan Milosevic was found dead in his cell at the UN war crimes detention centre in The Hague
