
Qatar plans to spend an average of 10% of its national output each year on building infrastructure as it prepares to host the soccer World Cup in 2022

- 2 Hamad International Airport: Will feature two of world's longest runways and 510,000 square-metre passenger terminal. \$17.5bn
- 3 Msheireb: Real estate project will restore 750,000 square-metre area in style reminiscent of traditional Qatari architecture. \$6.4bn
